The Parish Council has managed to continue with a full complement of 9 councillors, supported by a very experienced and seasoned Clerk/Financial Officer; makes for a very good start to the next period. Remembering of course, our obligations under the Code of Conduct and the Civility & Respect Pledge we have signed up to, plays a vital part in working together to focus on looking outward.

In closing, and remembering that we are all volunteers, some of which have a great deal of commitments having busy lives as parents/carers, holding employment and in some cases; are involved with other great voluntary work, all contributes to a forward looking Parish Council.
