Rainfall

Here is the report of the rainfall in January and February.

Rainfall for January 2023-58.5 mm (Average January rainfall - 65.9 mm)

Rainfall for February 2023 - 15 mm (Average February rainfall - 58.1 mm)

Rainfall for year to date - 73.5 mm (Expected rainfall to date - 124mm)

Another year and another new record for the data I've been collecting for the last 21 years. This February was the driest February that I have recorded with 15mm of rain recorded - this is around 25% of the average rainfall figure for February. A real contrast was the second wettest February I recorded last year when there was 94 mm of precipitation- around 1.5" more than average.

January was just about average in terms of rain - 58.5 mm compared to an average of 65.9 mm. Taken together we have had a dry start to 2023. Already I have read reports in the media about fears of a drought in 2023. However, I have learnt that predicting such events is impossible.

February's meeting was a talk by Jane Dixon and Adam Dudley of WildPath Nature Tours. In the first

part Adam described how the couple were working in the corporate world in the United States when they became volunteers conducting tours for a wildlife charity. They enjoyed it so much that they decided to give up their jobs and turn their hobby into a very successful business and now do tours all over America. The couple live part of the year in Fangfoss and the remainder in Arizona. Jane then gave advice on how to attract wildlife to your garden and what is needed - food, water, a place to raise young and shelter - and offered practical suggestions how to do this. Even a local garden can attract up to 200 species!

Our March meeting was a fascinating talk entitled 'The importance of bees' by Bill Scrivens. He gave a wonderful description of the life of bees and the trials and tribulations of being a beekeeper having been stung a hundred times on one occasion! Did you know the average hive contains 70000 worker bees and 2000 drones? All with the purpose of keeping the queen bee and the colony alive. Did you know that honey found in Egyptian burial tombs was found to be still edible after thousands of years? Fascinating stuff. Members were able to purchase jars of this locally produced honey at the end of the evening and I can confirm it is delicious!

The Coronation is going to be an amazing celebration. As part of the service itself, King Charles will be anointed with holy oil by the Archbishop of Canterbury before he receives the crown. It is a sign of God strengthening the King to undertake the work - the oil represents the outpouring of the Holy Spirit for his work as monarch. The oil used is of significance to the King as it is olive oil from the Mount of Olives in Jerusalem and was consecrated in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre by the Orthodox Patriarch of Jerusalem. We also use holy oil in church. It is blessed each year by the Bishop of the Diocese. It is used to mark special moments in someone's life, often moments of change or when the person needs God's help and strength. Sometimes at baptism or christening services here in Garrowby a person is anointed. It celebrates the fact that each person is special and unique with a special ministry that will unfold over the course of their lives. We each have unique gifts and talents that we are called upon to use for the good not only of ourselves but for the whole community as best we can. This is why as part of the weekend's celebrations there is the idea of the Big Help Out. We may choose to use the extra Bank Holiday to visit family or friends but we can each be reminded that we live for others as well as for ourselves. Just as the Coronation marks a new beginning for the King, it can also be a challenge to all of us to make a difference. Living in this way is not always easy, but as I write this Easter is approaching and there are signs of spring and new beginnings in the fields and hedge rows. Whether we are religious or not it is a time of the year when we can commit to a fresh start in terms of our personal relationships and the priorities by which we live our lives. Even if things have been difficult in the past we can use our celebrations to let go of the past and look to the future.

Have a very Happy Easter and Coronation weekend.

Beck and Bells Update


Family Friendly Beck Walk: 11am Saturday 8th April - Meet outside the shop



Parish Council of Bugthorpe and Kirby Underdale

Minutes of the 159th Meeting of the Parish Council held at Kirby Underdale Village Hall on Monday 6 March 2023

Present: Councillors: D J Pearson - Chair T Atkinson, K Robinson, H T Paul, D Birks S W Huffington, R Crow, F Goodhart, D J Lord -Clerk

In attendance: Ward Councillor D N Rudd D Cary - Market Weighton Town Council and Sancton Parish Council

- **1. Apologies for Absence** were received from Lady Halifax.
- **2. Minutes of the Meeting** held on Monday 5 December 2022 were approved and signed as a true record by the Chair.
- **3. Declarations of Interest** the Parish Councils (Model Code of Conduct) Order 2001. There were no declarations of interest.
- 4. Matters Arising from the last Meeting:
- a) Jubilee Pasture Councillor Robinson reported that there had been no volunteer activity over the winter period. Two loads of stone have been moved down from Hanging Grimston by Ian Grice. These will be placed around the pond when ground conditions permit. The wording and illustrations for the interpretation board will soon be sent to a designer for the final mock up to be approved by the sub-committee. The stone bench is in process of been carved. The snowdrops and aconites that were planted have come through and have flowered.
- b) The collapse of road surface on Barf Hill unfortunately the ERYC when carrying out the repairs severed a BT cable and therefore lines in Bugthorpe have been off for a considerable period. Pressure is been exerted on BT by senior officers at ERYC to carry out the necessary repairs as soon as possible.
- c) Speed limit signs on Stephenwath Lane Councillor Atkinson confirmed that he would speak to the Headteacher at Bugthorpe School again regarding the children producing the signs. d) Kirby Underdale Village Hall refurbishment Councillor Atkinson reported that scaffolding has been erected to repair the barge boards and soffits. The plaster repairs, together with the internal and external painting will be complete before the Coronation on Sat 6 May 2023. The Clerk advised that the cost of repairs and improvements, including the replacement of the electric heating system, is to be split between the Village Hall Committee and Halifax Estates.

- The Committee holds residual funds from the Covid Grant.
- e) The Community Litter Pick 2003 The Clerk confirmed that the litter pick is to take place between 9am 11am on Saturday 25 March and the meeting place will be in the Estate Office car park at Bugthorpe.
- f) Restoration of Uncleby Tap Councillor Atkinson distributed photographs of Uncleby Tap and confirmed Halifax Estates will repair the brick work before the next Parish Council meeting, for the budgeted sum already agreed by the Parish Council of £150 including VAT.
- g) Repair/replacement of footpath bridge at Low Hall, Bugthorpe- Councillor Rudd confirmed that he has sent a reminder to the Senior Manager in the Civil Engineering Department of ERYC and is waiting for a response. Councillor Rudd was unaware as to why it has taken the Council so long to deal with this matter as the bridge was inspected many months ago. He agreed to keep the Clerk informed of progress on this matter.

5. Other Matters.

- a) Retrospective approval was given for the following payments:
- £1,338.12 to Halifax Estates for the telephone box. This includes VAT which is recoverable. £142.90 to Bugthorpe War Memorial Institute for reimbursement of Bugthorpe Village website domain and hosting costs. Councillor Robinson clarified that £100 of this is coming out the budget for Jubilee Pasture.

Councillor Robinson confirmed that she has paid £15 for Parish Council website domain and £36 for the WordPress plan for 2022-23 and Councillors agreed that she should therefore be reimbursed in the sum of £51. Councillor Robinson provided the Clerk with receipts on 8 February 2023.

- b) Parish Council Election for May 2023 all Councillors were given nomination forms and asked to complete and return them to the Clerk by Friday 31 March 2023 so that they can be hand delivered to County Hall, Beverley by 4pm on 4 April 2023.
- c) Woldgate School Admissions Policy following the recent campaign against the proposed changes to the Woldgate School admissions policy as from 2024, it has now been confirmed that pupils from Bugthorpe School will continue to be able to attend Woldgate as capacity should not be a problem over the next few years, following the recent building programme at the School. However, Councillor Atkinson remained concerned about the situation once capacity has been reached in a few years' time as Pocklington

continues to expand.

- d) The King's Coronation and Community Fund the Clerk reported that the grants between £100 and £500 are available for community events for the Coronation.
- e) The Litter on A166 the Clerk reported that ERYC have recently litter picked Garrowby Hill and that it is looking much better.
- f) Community Payback Projects the Clerk asked Councillors for any ideas for projects to put forward under the scheme. It was suggested that the painting of the Church railings both at Bugthorpe and Kirby Underdale should be considered. The Clerk is to pursue this.
- g) Potholes the Clerk confirmed that some of the potholes on York Lane have been repaired but there are still some very deep potholes particularly along the edge of highway which is hazardous to motorists when they pull off the road to make way for oncoming traffic. The Clerk is to take this up with the Area Engineer. Councillor Paul mentioned that there is a deep pothole near the junction of the Roman Road and Thixendale Road.
- 6. Correspondence- no comments were made.7. Any Other Business
- a) Councillor Rudd reported that the Council Tax for 2023-24 was agreed 9 February 2023 and that there will be a 4.99% increase which he thought was reasonable as it currently approximately 50% of the current inflation rate. The Council tax for a Band D property in Bugthorpe and Kirby Underdale parishes will be £2,103.49.
- b) Councillor Rudd confirmed that the Government has awarded ERYC an additional £761,000 for highway maintenance.
- c) Councillor Birks confirmed that the salt box on Beck Row has not been filled up again this winter.

The Clerk is to raise this with the Council to ensure that this filled for next winter.

- d) Jubilee Pasture it was agreed that any costs relating to Jubilee Pasture which fall within the Lottery funded grant already received, can be authorised by Councillors Pearson, Robinson and Lord without approval from the remaining Councillors.
- e) Councillor Birks reported that the street light on Beck Row is only working intermittently. The bulb was recently replaced and therefore there must be a faulty connection. Councillor Atkinson said he would instruct an electrician to repair the fault.
- f) Springfield Wood at Kirby Underdale was then discussed and all Councillors agreed that it would be an attractive feature in the landscape for future generations.
- g) The Chair reported that dog fouling is becoming a more regular problem in Kirby Underdale and he would monitor this ongoing. h) The Clerk reported that Halifax Estates have applied for planning permission for an oak framed garden room to be built on School Barn, Kirby Underdale. This will be considered by the Western Area Planning Committee on 11 April 2023
- i) Councillor Rudd announced that he will not be standing again as a Councillor in the May elections as he has decided to retire. The Chair and Clerk thanked him for the many years he has attended the Parish Council meetings and assisted with Parish issues.

240. The Chairman welcomed both members and guests and asked if anyone was proposing to record the meeting. Cllr Sumpner declared, that he intended to record the meeting and had been recording meetings for some time. Cllr Rigby advised

that Cllr Sumpner had failed in his duty by not declaring that he was recording. One councillor raised an objection to the recording and one member of the public declared that he was unaware that meetings were recorded but had no objections subject to the recordings not being shared with third parties. No assurances were given that data was secure and would be safely destroyed. Cllr Sumpner advised that he recorded the meetings for his own personal use. The clerk advised that this could be a potential breach of GDPR. Cllr Sumpner switched off his recording machine.

Cllr Rudd on agenda item 10 a and b - planning applications, as both councillors are members of ERYC planning committees.

243.Open Forum: There was no request for public participation.

244. Ward Councillors Report and outstanding issues

Cllr Rudd gave an update on ERYC council tax increase of 4.99%, 2.99% being a general increase and 2% for social care. Humberside Fire and Rescue have an increase of 5.5% and Humberside Police & Crime Commissioner 5.9%. ERYC intend to continue to offer a full range of services and four capital projects are planned, due to additional support from central government. A business day is to be held at Bridlington Spa on Friday 9th June - ticketed event. ERYC have received a further grant of £3.3million to further upgrade lights to LED, the A1079 and A164 will be upgraded. All 10 council waste sites are to have defibrillators installed at an investment of £7k.

Cllr Hammond advised that he had attended a meeting with Woldgate School to discuss the proposed changes in admission policy. A final decision is likely to be made by the board over the next few weeks.

The litter bin is now in place and is being used. The footpath at Vale Crescent has been repaired. Givendale Road has had some sections resurfaced.

A new meeting with Humber Forest re proposed tree planting to be rearranged with less councillors present.

The devolution 'Tour' conducted last year showed results overwhelming in favour of a mayoral authority.

A cyclist was quite seriously injured on Givendale Road - Cllr Rigby thanked Cllr Hammond for his intervention.

Cllr Berry advised that there were issues with litter on Garrowby Hill. Cllr King thanked Cllr Sumpner who has already made a start on collecting the litter. A further working party is to be organised to do more.

Cllr Berry has had a planning query as to whether large scale developers have to engage with highways re traffic flows? Cllr Hammond confirmed that this was part of the planning process. Cllr Berry also asked on behalf of a resident what is the benefit of holding an election? The response given was that we are a democratic socie-

ty. An election will only be triggered however if

the council has more candidates than seats.

245. It was proposed by Cllr Berry and seconded by Cllr Kress that the minutes of the meeting held on the 23rd January 2023 be signed as a true copy. Resolved

- **246.** Matters Arising: update on outstanding items from previous meeting.
- a) Cllr Rigby advised that some verges have been repaired and roads partially cleaned, but now needed sweeping. Further information to be sent to the clerk for a letter to be raised for residents' benefit.
- b) The request for a new footpath along Main Street to Wolds Edge was considered. No proposals in favour of this were received. Cllr King proposed and Cllr Haywood seconded opposing the request. Cllr Berry abstained. Resolved c) Cllr Rigby acknowledged correspondence received from residents regarding the re-siting of benches on the village green. Options were discussed and it was agreed that the preferred option would be to lift the bench and extend the concrete stand and reposition the bench further back from the edge of the road. Cllr Sumpner advised that this needed to be done for benches at both sides of the road.
- d) The clerk advised that a ticket has now been issued for the installation of street light shades on the requested lamps.

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
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
