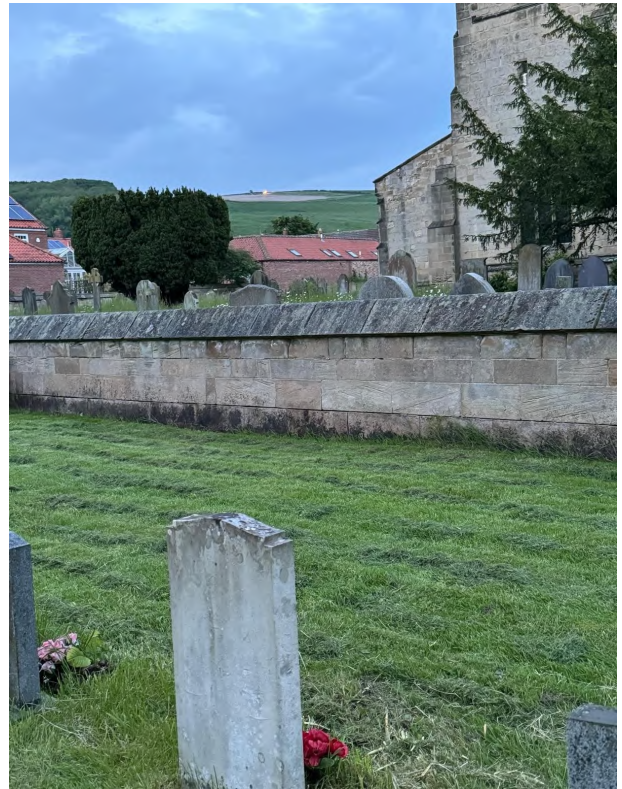

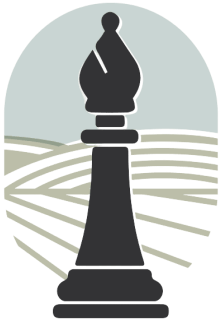

## ***Bishop Wilton Show - Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> July 2024***

What a Show! Glorious weather and a field packed full of entertainment brought the numbers up to High Callis on Saturday 20th July. Every section of the show had a positive and vibrant buzz about it. Back to its agricultural roots, while still providing fun for all the family. In particular the circus workshop and the Purple Pig Company, all very busy throughout the day.

The Bishop Wilton Beast started the non-stop action in the Main Ring at 09:30, and this year really lived up to its name! Run organiser Stuart Smith designed a challenging circuit that had everyone suitably exhausted, but elated at the end of it. The new, completely off road event, despite the terrain, producing some seriously impressive times.

A huge turnout for the Horse classes created non-stop action on the far side of the field. Show Jumping has grown considerably since its reintroduction last year. A highlight in the pony section - the Clarkson's Farm winners in the fancy dress competition!

Dogs are always popular at the Bishop Wilton Show; this year with dog agility, terrier racing and the Hunsley Beagles in the Main Ring. The Dog Zone proved very popular, next door ring to the highly trained dogs in the scurry! Something for every dog lover.

There were over one hundred sheep entered in to the show, and that was just online before the show! Strong competition from some fine looking stock really giving the judges something to think about. A Sheep agility competition providing some entertainment!

First time commentator Sharon Cawood, did a fantastic job in keeping us all updated on what was going on in the Main Ring and around the Show Ground. Her informative and unflustered commentary a fitting tribute to the great Bob Sefton that held the role for so long.





Committee Chairman and 'Master of the Main Ring' Ed Hutchinson was as enthusiastic as ever teasing out the stories of the vintage cars and machinery, before passionately talking about farming through the ages. The enormous Claas combine alongside its vintage relative was a sight to behold. Put them in the same field as the powerful Percheron horses and you can really see how things have moved on!

With much better weather, the vintage car parade was as impressive as ever with some gorgeous classics. Tim and Caroline Wardle very kindly brought along some serious horsepower, with their own potent collection of cars, trucks and tractors too. It was great to see various local trucks, tractors and stationary engines all brought in by their proud owners too. Thank you.

All the trade stands, food outlets and the bar were delighted with the footfall. The wonderful people at the Gait Inn even producing our own glasses especially for the Show!

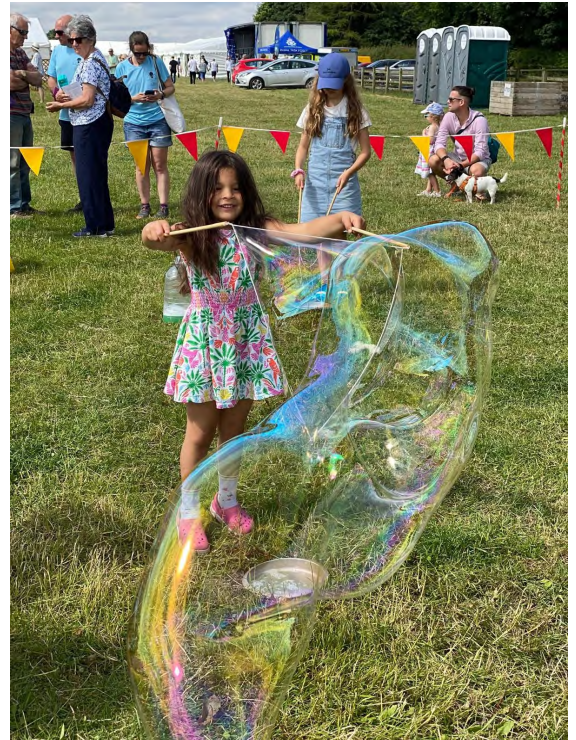

# Rainfall

## Rainfall for May and June 2024 in Bishop Wilton

Rainfall for May 2024 - 66 mm (Average Rainfall May 2003-2024 - 55.6 mm)

Rainfall for June 2024 - 48mm (Average Rainfall June 2003-2024 - 63.7mm)

Rainfall for 2024 so far - 447.8mm (Average Rainfall Jan-June 2003-2024 - 335.5mm)

Rainfall for the Meteorological Spring 2024 (March, April and May) - 211.5mm (Average Spring rainfall - 147.2mm)

May 2024 was a little wetter than average with Bishop Wilton receiving just less than half an inch more rain than average.

June 2024 was actually drier than average with Bishop Wilton receiving just a little more than half an inch less than average.

The total rainfall in 2024 is much higher than average - around 33% more rain than average.

Spring 2024 has been the fifth wettest in the 22 years I have been recording rainfall.

Notably June 2024 has been the first month in the year since June 2023 that a month has recorded less than average precipitation. Unsurprisingly the year from July 2023 to June 2024 has seen the wettest 12 month period that I have recorded. A total of 1187mm (46.7") precipitation fell from July 2023 to June 2024. The average rainfall for this period from 2003-2024 is 739mm (29.1"). This means that we have had in the last year an remarkable 448mm (17.5") more rain than average. The previous wettest corresponding period was July 2015-June 2016 when we had 924mm (36.4").

These figures confirm what we all know: ie. the last 12 months has been exceptionally wet!

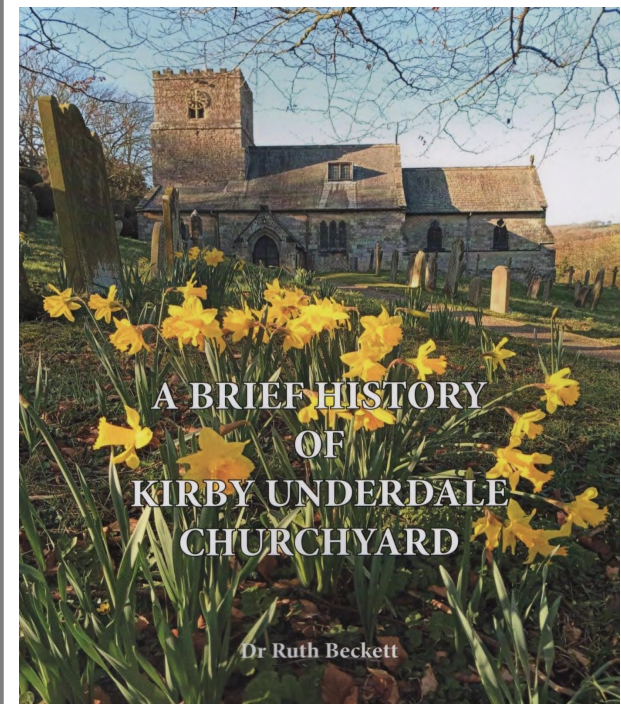

## All Saints' Church, Kirby Underdale

On Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> May, we welcomed a visiting group from Whitkirk parish in Leeds. After listening to a talk on the history of the church, the group had time to explore both church and churchyard before enjoying refreshments in the village hall.

Temple Newsam in Whitkirk parish was previously owned by ancestors of the present Lord Halifax. It was in 1922 that Edward Lindley Wood, who became Viscount Halifax in 1934 and 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Halifax in 1944, sold Temple Newsam to Leeds Corporation. One of the conditions of the sale was that a service should be held each year to commemorate the occasion. This service is provided by Whitkirk Church. On 15<sup>th</sup> June All Saints' Church hosted another talk, this time on the history of the churchyard and the lives of some of the people buried there. This was one of many events being organised nationwide as part of 'Love Your Burial Ground Week'. Visitors were able to purchase copies of [A Brief History of Kirby Underdale Churchyard](#), all proceeds going towards the church.

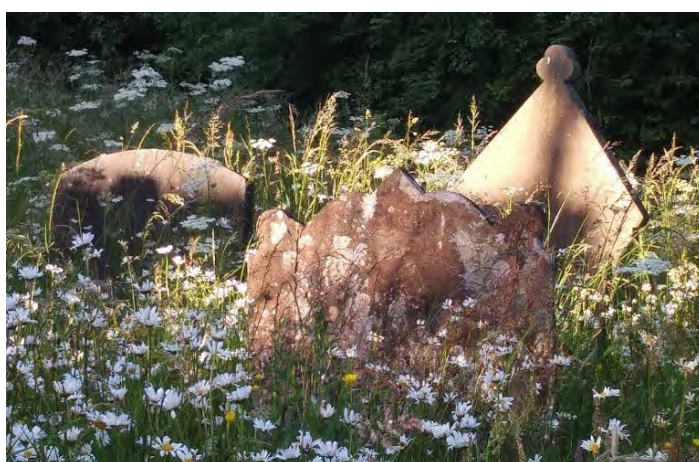
Also as part of the 'Love your Burial Ground Week', a wildflower survey has been completed in Kirby Underdale Churchyard. With the help of Martin Stringer from Nunburnholme and Katherine Robinson from Bugthorpe, we identified more than fifty different species. Nor was it simply wildflowers attracting attention. There are lichens too in the churchyard and trees to identify. A booklet on the wildflowers in Kirby Underdale Churchyard is available in church. It is hoped to be able to produce a more detailed booklet later in the year with even more information about the botanical history of the flowers and some of the folk traditions which are attached to them.

In order to create a habitat for wildflowers, different areas of Kirby Underdale Churchyard are being managed in different ways. Some areas have been cut. A large area to the east of the church path, however, has been left to allow meadowsweet, ox-eye daisies and meadow cranesbill to flower. A path has been cut to allow people to enjoy the wildflowers and to look at some of the old gravestones here. All the churchyard will be cut in early autumn.

Minutes of the 164<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Parish Council held at Bugthorpe War Memorial Institute on Monday 20 May 2024

### **1. Election of Officers:**

Chair - Councillor Lord proposed Councillor Pearson, and this was seconded by Councillor Birks.

Vice Chair - Councillor Pearson proposed Councillor Birks, and this was seconded by Councillor Lord.

Clerk - Councillor Pearson proposed Ed Johnson, and this was seconded by Councillor Goodhart.

**2. Apologies for absence** received from Councillor Lady Halifax, Councillor Atkinson and Councillor Paul.

**3.** The Chair welcomed Councillor Reagan to her first Parish Council Committee Meeting.

**4. The Minutes of the Meeting** held on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> March 2024 were signed as a true record, by the Chair.

**5. Declarations of Interest** - The Parish Councils (Model Code of Conduct) order 2001. There were no declarations of interest.

**6. Matters arising from the last Meeting:**

a) Councillor Crow raised that it had been remarked to him that the previous minutes in relation to dog fouling were too detailed and therefore may as well name the individual. Councillor Reagan agreed that she felt the minutes could have been worded slightly differently.

Councillor Crow went on to say that dog fouling was still happening. The Chair remarked that this remained limited in Kirby Underdale.

b) Pedestrian bridge across Beck at Low Hall - Councillor Hammond reported that this particular bridge is 217<sup>th</sup> on ERYC list so a repair is not imminent. Although there were no handrails the bridge is thought to be structurally safe. Councillor Hammond did remark that another nearby bridge is due to be repaired shortly (Footpath 2 - 20<sup>th</sup> on the list) so HE may be able to push for a repair to the Low Hall bridge at the same time.

c) Kirby Underdale Village Hall refurbishment - The Clerk reported that all the refurbishment work has been completed. Councillor Lord said the new photographs were still to go up due to a little bit of recent damp ingress.

d) Travellers on A166 have moved on.

e) Community Litter Pick - The Clerk reported approximately 35 bags of rubbish were picked up and that there was a good turnout.

**7. Broadband provision and mobile phone coverage** - Project Gigabit Lot 8 - Councillor Hammond reported that a private provider had won the tender process for Lot 8 but couldn't tell the meeting the name. The Clerk said it was Quickline having held a recent meeting with them regarding Halifax Estates. It was commented that the provision of fibre broadband would still be a number of years off due to the length of contract. The Clerk explained that Quickline were hoping to move a number of customers in July onto 5G served from the Garrowby Hill Mast which should improve the service for those that remain on the service supplied from the smaller telegraph poles.

**8. CPR & Defibrillator training** - Training will be on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> September at the Bugthorpe War Memorial Institute at 7pm. Further details will be published in the Parish Pump.

**9. Parish Council Precept** - The Clerk confirmed £4,300 has been received.

**10. Potholes & verges**- Councillor Lord remarked that the jet patcher had been along York Road but felt that the road from Painsthorpe Hall to the Roman Road was still poor. Councillor Hammond will follow up with ERYC. Regarding verges, Councillor Goodhart said that the verges are badly overgrown

between Kirby Underdale and Painsthorpe Hall. Councillor Hammond noted that ERYC are busy cutting verges at the moment so hopefully these will be done soon. There was a general remark regarding the hedge at Bobby Hill which appeared to be encroaching onto the road. Councillor Lord confirmed that although Halifax Estates normally cut this, it is probably something for the ERYC to do. The Clerk is to send Councillor Hammond a plan. Councillor Birks mentioned about the drain by the entrance to Thoraby, which has caused problems in the past, together with the possibility of further wear and tear along this road due to the bridge at Stamford Bridge being closed. The Clerk will have a look at the drain, but Councillor Lord confirmed that it is currently clear.

**11. Change of Parish Council signatories** -

The Chair confirmed that signatories are now Councillor Lord, Councillor Crow and Councillor Birks and himself.

**12. Approval required for payments and cheques** as set out in the agenda - Signed by the Chair and Councillor Birks and approval given by the rest of the Committee.
